

We form a unique, international twin city of **32,000** inhabitants on the border of two states. Our total **Area is 3 216** sqm.

- Two cultures
- Two time zones (Sweden -1 hour to Finland)
- Two currencies, euro and Swedish crown
- Three languages: Finnish, Swedish and our local dialect which is spoken on both sides of the border (Meän kieli)

Our joint city center is growing on the national boundary of Finland and Sweden.

- Development and growth


HOW?


